Dear Mini School Students and Parents/Guardians – Grades 8, 10, and 12:

Our trip to Strathcona Park Lodge will take place from Monday, Sept 25 to Friday, Sept 29, 2023.

On Monday, Sept 25 students should be in the parking lot at the front of the school at 8:50 am in order to load the bus, take attendance, and catch the ferry at Horseshoe Bay to board at 11:05 am. The Lodge is located west of Campbell River on Vancouver Island. We will be taking another bus from the ferry in Nanaimo to the Lodge. Students should bring a bagged lunch for Monday and have it packed separately so that it is available during the bus trip. We will be returning to Templeton Secondary at approximately 4:30 pm on Friday, Sept 29. Our ferry arrives in Horseshoe Bay at 3:05pm and traffic will determine our arrival at the school.

Please see the Enrichment Fee Payment Schedule, on the back of this page, for information on the best option to suit your needs. Payment is due on or before Friday, September 15. Please make your cheque(s) payable to Templeton Secondary School. Alternatively, payment may be made via Online Cash. No student will be denied the opportunity to participate in the program because of an inability to pay this fee, as per VSB Financial Hardship Policy. Bursaries are available. Please contact Mr. Raza Mirani, Principal (in confidence).

For all high-risk outdoor activities at Strathcona, students will be divided into groups of up to 10 with two adult chaperones. One or more of these chaperones will be a certified outdoor recreation leader from Strathcona. The leaders for all out trips have first aid certification and radio communication with the basecamp for emergencies. Students will be housed in cabins/dorms with shared bedrooms and bathrooms. Grade 8s have one overnight camping trip and all other grades will have a two or three-night trip. On these nights, students will sleep under a tarp with up to 12 people, including chaperones, at the same campsite.

STRATHCONA PARK LODGE PACKING LIST

All program participants, including chaperones, require appropriate clothing and equipment to participate in SPL programs. Consider this a list of "must-haves" regardless of the season.

The weather can be unpredictable, participants need to be prepared for whatever nature brings us, no matter the forecast!

NOTES ABOUT CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR

LAYER UPI For active outdoor pursuits, the best way to regulate body temperature is to wear layers of clothing that can be adjusted depending on the weather, temperature and activity level. Layers should include long underwear, warm mid-layers and waterproof outerwear. Woal, nylan, polyester and synthetic fleece are recommended as they provide insulation even when wet. They also dry quickly!

PREPARE FOR UNEXPECTED WEATHER. In early spring or late fall you'll want to add some warmer layers - it has unexpectedly snowed here at those times! June thru mid-September you may want extra shorts and T-shirts.

COTTON IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AS A WARM LAYER. It doesn't insulate when wet and is slow to dry!

THE IMPORTANCE OF PROPER RAIN GEAR CANNOT BE OVERSTATED. Raingear must be waterproof (coated PVC or Gore-Tex) as opposed to water resistant – if you can't stay dry in the shower while wearing your rain gear, it is not appropriate for the outdoors. This is NOT A JOKE.

REDUCE CLOTHING WASTE. It should not be necessary to purchase new items to enjoy your SPL experience. We recommend borrowing, renting or purchasing second hand items that you do not already own.
